2015 Annual Statistical Summary

This agency handled 35,096 calls-for-service between January 1, 2015 and December 31, 2015.

Uniformed Patrol Division

The **Uniformed Patrol Division** activities for the **Year 2015** are as follows:

Drug Arrests by Uniformed Patrol Division

93 separate physical arrests were made by Uniformed Patrol Division personnel during the *Year* **2015** for drug related offenses.

Warrant Arrests

309 arrests were made by Patrol Division personnel during the *Year 2015* on court-issued warrants.

Criminal and SC Complaints

668 Criminal complaint summonses/warrants were signed by officers within the Patrol Division during the *Year 2015*.

Directed Enforcement Details

4,072 documented directed enforcement details were completed during the Year 2015.

First Aid Calls

2,143 emergency first aid calls were answered by patrol officers during the **Year 2015**.

Investigative Division

The **Investigative Division** activities for the **Year 2015** are as follows:

Case Management

226 cases were assigned during the **Year 2015** and currently **111** of the **226** remain open.

78 of the **226** assigned cases were closed during the **Year 2015**.

Off-hour Duty Calls

27 incidents required a detective to respond in during off hours during the Year 2015.

Grand Jury Court Appearances

26 cases required the appearance of a detective at Grand Jury during the Year 2015.

Drug Arrests by Detectives

38 separate physical arrests were made by Detective Bureau personnel during the *Year 2015* for drug related offenses.

Prescription Drop Box

In excess of **1309** pounds of medication were collected in the Prescription Drop Box during the **Year 2015**.

Background Investigations

Firearms - 415 firearms background investigations were conducted for **651** permits which were processed during the **Year 2015**.

Employment - 38 background investigations were conducted during the Year 2015.

Volunteer Fire/First Aid - 9 volunteer background investigations were processed during **Year 2015**.

Solicitor - 11 solicitor permit backgrounds were processed during Year 2015.

Property & Evidence

The **Property & Evidence Function** activities for **Year 2015** are as follows:

314 pieces of **Stolen Property** were entered into the property module during the **Year 2015**.

19 pieces of Lost Property were entered into the property module during the Year 2015.

424 pieces of **Found Property** were entered into the property module during the **Year 2015** (includes recovered items and items held for safekeeping).

90 Impounded Vehicles were entered into the property module during the Year 2015

1,499 Articles of Evidence were entered into the property module during the Year 2015.

226 Firearm/Weapon items were entered into the property module during the Year 2015.

125 Firearms/Weapons were delivered to the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Gun Unit during the *Year 2015*.

The majority of the Internal Affairs investigations in 2015 related to allegations of violations of department rules and regulations. Two of the investigations related to supervisory disciplinary action initiated by agency supervisors and documented through the formal Internal Affairs process. Of the Internal Affairs cases closed in 2015 which alleged any form of potential misconduct, most complaints were made during or immediately following arrests and the complaints were not supported by the facts. The classification of "unfounded" is due to all indications being that the incident that was alleged did not occur as opposed to a classification of "exonerated" which indicates the incident did occur and the officer's actions were correct and proper. While an Internal Affairs complaint may be readily disprovable via video or other evidence at the time of the complaint is filed, the Lacey Township Police Department strictly adheres to the New Jersey Internal Affairs Guidelines which results in the cataloguing, investigation, and statistical reporting of all complaints.
